TO PARTICIPATE IN 25TH ANNIVERSARY CONVENTION

A total of four faculty members from the University of Montana Department of Interpersonal Communication will participate in the Silver Anniversary Convention of the International Communication Association (ICA) Wednesday through Saturday, April 23-26, in Chicago, Ill.

Dr. Eldon E. Baker, chairperson of the department, who is U.S. site coordinator for ICA audit projects, will participate in the organizational communication audit project at the convention.

Dr. Duane D.
