A viola recital by Bernard McWilliams, assistant professor of music at the University of Montana, will be presented at 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 20, in the UM Music Recital Hall.

The faculty recital, sponsored by the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, is open to the public without charge.

McWilliams will be accompanied during the program by pianist Constance Speake, an assistant professor of music education at UM. Assisting will be Frank Diliberto, a visiting lecturer at UM, who will play the string bass, and UM music Prof. Eugene Andrie, violin.

Works on Tuesday's program include "Sonata, Opus 11 No. 4" by Hindemith; "Erste Suite fur Violin, Viola und Kontrabass" by Fritz Skorzeny; "Sonata in G Major" by Flackton, and "Sonata, Opus 120 No. 2" by Brahms.
