CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES  
November 15, 1949

The meeting was called to order by John Holding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Holding introduced Mrs. Skjonsby who displayed two of her portraits. She asked permission to hang them in the Student Union, advertising to students that they can have their portraits painted for \$18. Halvorson moved that Central Board give Mrs. Skjonsby permission to display her portraits in the Student Union. Hennessy seconded the motion. Carried. *referred to Student Union*

Representatives of W.A.A. asked for a permanent concession to sell crepe paper pom-poms on campus. They were asked to discuss the matter with Miss Clow and then present the request to Central Board next week.

Fred Cunningham from the Athletic Department recommended that Central Board approve the same seating for home basketball games as was approved last year -- that the north side seats on the main floor be reserved for season ticket and complimentary ticket holders. 1900 seats remain for the student body. Fox moved that Central Board accept the recommendation of the Athletic Department for seating at home basketball games. Wohlgenant seconded the motion. Carried.

Mr. Gray, director of the University band, presented a drawing in color of the proposed new band uniforms. He asked permission to purchase the uniforms through the Mercantile. He said the difference in price would be negligible and there would be greater convenience in local tailoring services. It was agreed that Mr. Gray have a uniform tailored according to the drawing and bring it to Central Board. It was also decided that Mr. Gray secure price estimates from various local firms before Central Board decides what firm to deal with.

Holding announced that he has appointed a campus safety committee. Edna Geary is the chairman.

The question of the junior class election of November 9 was brought up. The election was held although only 113 juniors were present. 142 were needed to validate the election. After considerable discussion Halvorson moved that Central Board validate the last election by a waiver of Article V of the By-laws. Wohlgenant seconded the motion. The motion did not carry.

Motion by Fox that a junior class meeting be held Tuesday, November 22 at 4:30 in the Student Union auditorium with Dave Freeman in charge. Lambros seconded the motion. Carried.

Holding announced that Central Board will hold its regular meeting on Monday, November 21 at 4:00 and will meet Tuesday, November 22 at 4:30 to count junior ballots.

Discussion followed on the proposal for a campus community chest. Freeman moved that all fund-raising drives on campus be consolidated in a single campus chest drive for the school year of 1949-1950. Halvorson seconded the motion. Carried.

Helding appointed Bob Moran as chairman of a meeting to be held with all drive leaders on campus.

Helding presented a request for a donation from ASMSU for the Russell Memorial Fund to place a statue of Charles Russell in Washington, D.C. The Bearpaws were requested to attend the campus chest meeting in regard to the donation, and also to investigate the possibilities of securing some of Russell's paintings for an exhibit on campus.

The meeting was then adjourned.
