Career workshops for new UM students will be from 2-4 p.m. and 7:30-10 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 25, in the UC 361 series rooms. Workshop leaders include Dr. Thomas E. Mortier, career counselor of the UM Career Planning and Placement Services, and Dr. John E. Stenger, counseling psychologist for the UM Center for Student Development (CSD).

Various campus organizations will set up information booths and other displays at UM for the "Activities Fair," which will be from 4:30-6:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 25, in the University Oval.

Stenger and Dr. Fred A. Weldon, CSD director, will hold assertiveness training sessions for new freshmen and transfer students from 10 a.m.-noon Friday, Sept. 26, in rooms 360 I-J of the UC. "How to Get Involved," a panel discussion on campus activities, will feature representatives of the Associated Students of UM, the Student Action Center, Student Affairs Office and the dormitory resident-assistants group at 2 p.m. Friday in UC 360 I-J.

Advising sessions for new freshmen and transfer students are scheduled at 3 p.m. Monday and from 9 a.m.-noon and 1-5 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in the UC Ballroom.

Recreational facilities in the UM Recreation Annex will be open from 8 a.m.-10 p.m. Monday through Friday.
