Dr. Albert Borgmann, professor of / philosophy at the University of Montana in Missoula, will present the first in a series of nine free public lectures dealing with the relationship between humanities and the environment on Monday, Sept. 29, at UM.

Borgmann will discuss "The Humanities and the Environment" at 7:30 p.m. Monday in room 215 of the University Women's Center. Each of the nine Monday programs in the series will be at 7:30 p.m. in WC 215.

The series of one-hour discussions, available for one graduate or undergraduate credit under the EVST 390 listing, "Environmental Studies Lecture Series," also will include question-answer sessions following the respective talks. Grading for those taking the series for credit will be on the pass-no pass system.

The series, sponsored by the UM Environmental Studies Program, is being conducted on the theme, "A Sense of Place."

Anyone taking the series for credit may pay the \$21 fee and sign up for the course at the first class session Monday or at the UM Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs, (CCESP), room 107 of Main Hall.
