'AMERICAN FOREIGN POLICY AFTER VIETNAM'
IS THEME OF MANSFIELD LECTURE PROGRAM AT UM

MISSOULA--

"American Foreign Policy After Vietnam" will be the theme of the sixth program in the continuing Mansfield Lectures on International Relations Wednesday through Saturday, Oct. 29-Nov. 1, at the University of Montana.

Keynote speakers for various discussions scheduled during the four-day event will include three former government officials--Dr. Daniel Ellsberg, George W. Ball and Dr. Walt W. Rostow. Ellsberg, who held several government posts, is the man who made public the secret Pentagon Papers on the Vietnam War; Ball is former Under Secretary of State, and Rostow was an adviser to Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson.

Free public lectures in the Mansfield series are scheduled in the University Theater on various days by the three men. Ellsberg will speak at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 29; Ball will speak at 8 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 30, and Rostow will speak from 3-5 p.m. Friday, Oct. 31.

University students, faculty, staff and UM associates will meet informally with the guest lecturers during the four-day program.

Ellsberg, San Francisco, Calif., is now an economist, political scientist and author. Ball is a partner of Lehman Brothers, an international investment banking firm, as well as managing director of Lehman Brothers Inc. Ball also is counsel to the law firm of Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen and Hamilton, New York, N.Y. Rostow has been a professor of economics and history at the University of Texas, Austin, since February 1969.

The Mansfield lecture program was established in 1967 at UM under the Mike and Maureen Mansfield Endowment of the UM Foundation in recognition of Senate Majority Leader Mansfield's 25 years of congressional service and the University's 75th anniversary, which coincided in 1968. The series is funded through the UM Foundation under donations of about \$120,000.
