BELL CHEVIGNY TO PRESENT WOMEN'S MOVEMENT PROGRAMS MONDAY, NOV. 3, IN MISSOULA

MISSOULA --

Bell Chevigny of the State University of New York (SUNY), <u>Purchase</u>, <u>N.Y.</u>, will deliver a special lecture entitled "Women's Struggle for Independence and Equality: the History of the Women's Movement" at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Nov. 3, at the Missoula City Library.

Chevigny will also discuss her research and upcoming biographical book on Margaret Fuller, a U.S. feminist of the 1880s, at noon Monday in the University of Montana Women's Resource Center (WRC) in the University Center. The book Chevigny will discuss is entitled "The Best of Margaret Fuller."

Both sessions are free and open to the public. All interested persons are invited to attend.

Chevigny holds a bachelor of arts degree from Wellesley College, Wellesley, Mass., and has master of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees from Yale University, New Haven, Conn. She is a fellow of the Danforth Foundation. Chevigny has taught at Sarah Lawrence College, Bronxville, N.Y. She currently holds a position with SUNY.

Chevigny is now on a lecture tour of several colleges and universities in the northwest. Her Missoula visit is sponsored by the WRC and the UM humanities department.
