"One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest," Dale Wasserman's stage adaptation of the best selling novel of the same name by Ken Kesey, will open Wednesday, Nov. 5, and run through Sunday, Nov. 9 at 8 p.m. in the University of Montana Masquer Theater.

A sometimes hilarious, subtly unsettling and always entertaining production, "One Flew Over The Kuckoo's Nest," is the story of an energetic and all-too-often independant young man, Randle MacMurphy, who has been tossed mercilessly into a world of order and ultimate organization.
