CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES  
November 16, 1948

The meeting was opened by the president and the minutes of the previous meeting read and approved.

Mueller reported that the \$180 that Central Board had approved of to be used to put ads in all state papers was given back to us.

Mueller reported that Sally Holt had asked if Central Board would approve of a World Student Service Fund campaign on this campus. McCleod moved that Central Board approve of a campaign to raise funds for W.S.S.F. on campus during winter quarter. Bergh seconded the motion and the motion passed.

The meeting was then adjourned.


Badgley explained that the Athletic Board was having a difficult time meeting current expenses because their estimated income was not forthcoming until the veteran's fees were sent by the government at the end of the quarter. He submitted the following requests to Central Board:

1. That Central Board authorize a loan from the Reserve Fund equivalent to the estimated income for winter quarter which would be approximately \$6,500. This amount would be paid back when the veteran's fees materialize.
2. That additional income to help take care of the deficits be derived from a pro-rata distribution of the sale of wife's Activity tickets. This amount was formerly put into the General Fund.
3. Because of the limited seating capacity and the desirability of selling reserve seats to townspeople, Badgley asked Central Board to consider the possibility of limiting student attendance at home games to 50% each night. This should open more seats to the public and should therefore mean a greater revenue.

Lucas then made the motion that Central Board authorize a loan, equal to the department's estimated income, to the Athletic Board from the Permanent Reserve Fund of the Associated Students, at the beginning of each quarter for the 1948-49 school year, the same to be repaid as the estimated income materializes. Lucas then recommended that Mr. Badgley's last two requests be referred to the Budget and Finance committee to be acted upon by a special meeting of Central Board Thursday at 4:00. Freeman seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Mueller appointed Lucas and Johnson to investigate the complaint that the Music Club is having letters very similar to those of the M Club.

The meeting was then adjourned.
