2 ONE-ACT PLAYS, POETRY READING
SET IN GALLERY OF VISUAL ARTS

MISSOULA--

The Gallery of Visual Arts in Turner Hall at the University of Montana will sponsor presentations of two one-act plays Monday, Dec. 8, and an open poetry reading Wednesday, Dec. 10, at the gallery. There will be no admission charge for either of the programs.

One-act plays to be presented at 8 p.m. Monday include "Ludlow Fair" by Lanford Wilson and "Lemonade" by James Prideaux. The plays characterize lonely women in various phases of their lives.

Four women who have done extensive theater work throughout the country will be featured in the two productions--Katherine Brown, Loyalton, Calif.; Valerie Spencer, Los Altos, Calif.; Sally Sommer, El Paso, Tex., and Anne Garde, Brooklyn, N.Y. Sommer will direct "Ludlow Fair" and Garde will direct "Lemonade."

Wednesday's poetry reading, also set for 8 p.m. in the Gallery of Visual Arts, will feature readings by all interested persons. Anyone may come and read and share various poems with others. The program also is open to all those who wish to listen to the readings.

In conjunction with the Gallery of Visual Arts poetry readings, KUFM, the student-operated, non-commercial radio station at the University, will broadcast readings of various works at 11:30 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 11.
