JACK DOTY TO TEACH MANAGEMENT COURSE
JAN. 7-MARCH 10 IN KALISPELL

KALISPELL--

Dr. Jack H. Doty, professor of management in the School of Business Administration at the University of Montana in Missoula, will teach a course entitled "Management of New Enterprises and Small Business" beginning Wednesday, Jan. 7, at Flathead High School, Kalispell.

The class, to be presented for three graduate or undergraduate credits, will be taught by Doty each Wednesday evening through March 10, and is offered under the University course listing, "Business Administration 499."

The course is open to residents of Kalispell and vicinity. Class hours will be 7-10 p.m. each Wednesday.

Cost of enrolling in the class will be \$63 for those taking it for credit and \$31.50 for nonparticipating class auditors. Enrollment will be limited to 20. Enrollees will register and pay fees at the first class session Jan. 7 at Flathead High School.

Included in the course will be an analysis and discussion of selected cases and readings which present the major management problems characteristic of new and small enterprises, including a critical examination of attitudes and abilities required of the successful entrepreneur or owner-manager.

The course is being offered through the UM Center for Continuing Education and Summer Programs, room 107, Main Hall, University of Montana, Missoula, Mont. 59801.

A brief report stressing the feasibility study and requiring the student to establish a new venture "on paper" or to reorganize an existing venture is included.

"Successful practitioners will be invited to speak and present specific problems out of their experiences to the class," Doty said.

Those taking the management class for graduate credit will be required to do a comprehensive report stressing the feasibility study and requiring the student to establish a new venture "on paper."
