PROGRAMS FOR '71 UM SUMMER SESSION

MISSOULA--

The University of Montana's 1971 Summer Session will include five workshops and seminars offered by the UM Department of Home Economics.

The programs, available credits and dates include "Music and the Pre-School Child Inter-session Workshop," 3 credits, June 14-18; "Sex and Sexuality Education" (sponsored by the State Department of Health), 2 credits, June 14-18; "Marriage and Family Relations," 3 credits, June 28-July 9; "Student Involvement Key to Teaching Consumer Education," 2 credits, July 12-16; and "Environment for the Education of Young Children," 2 credits, June 21-25.

Leading the music and preschool child workshop will be Martha Faulhaber, author of "Rhythms, Music and Instruments to Make," and accompanist for the Chicago Children's Choir, and Ella Jenkins, performing artist. Dr. Deryck Calderwood, a member of Guidance Associates, Pleasantville, N.Y., will be consultant for the sex and sexuality seminar.

The seminar on environmental education will feature Allen Lietman, director, Early Childhood Education Study at the Education Development Center, Newton, Mass. Dr. F. Clark Swain, a marriage counselor who is a professor of marriage and family life at Montana State University, Bozeman, will conduct the marriage and family seminar.

Mrs. Agnes Cada, home economics instructor at Columbia Falls High School, Columbia Falls, will lead the consumer education seminar. Mrs. Cada is the recipient of a Montana Vocational Consumer Homemaking Grant.
