WORKS AT UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

Mary B. Cordingley, a noted artist from Great Falls, will present an exhibit of her works at the University of Montana Center Gallery March 17-April 7.

The exhibit, entitled "Issues of the 70's," will be open for public viewing from 1-4 p.m. seven days a week.

Mrs. Cordingley was awarded her bachelor's degree from Carleton Collège, Northfield, Minn., and her master's degree from the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis.

She has studied art under several noted artists, including Bernie Quick and Paul Olsen of the Minneapolis School of Art and Design; Arthur Kerrick, Minneapolis; Hilton Leech of the School of Art, Sarasota, Fla.; Peter Busa, University of Minnesota; and Steve Rettegi of Hungary.

Mrs. Cordingley has exhibited her works in six states. She has received numerous art awards in Montana and Minnesota and is a member of the Montana Arts Council.

Mrs. Cordingley's individual art shows have been held at Stapps and Charles M. Russell Gallery, Great Falls; Reeders Alley, Helena; and at Gabberts, Minneapolis.

The author of the book "This I Believe," Mrs. Cordingley has also worked in pediatrics and child psychiatry. She is listed in "Who's Who of American Women," "Who's Who of the West," and "Two Thousand Women of Achievement."

Mrs. Cordingley is married to the publisher of the Great Falls Tribune, William A. Cordingley. The couple has three children.
