21 NIGHT COURSES OFFERED AT UM SPRING QUARTER

MISSOULA--

Twenty-one night courses will be offered during spring quarter at the University of Montana by the UM Extension Division.

Mary Margaret Courtney, Extension Division supervisor, said adults and others who wish to take one or more of the courses should register at the first meeting of each class. Fee is \$16 per credit.

Most of the courses meet one night each week, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.

The night program begins March 30 and ends June 10. Miss Courtney said the night courses are self-supporting, so courses with insufficient numbers of enrollees will not be offered.
