ITAA FESTIVAL  
MAY 13-15 AT UM

MISSOULA--

High school, college and community groups, and interested individuals will participate in the third annual festival of the <sup>Interpretive</sup> Theatre Alliance of America (ITAA) May 13-15 at the University of Montana.

The noncompetitive program is under the direction of David M. Fisher, an assistant professor of communication at UM who is first vice president of the ITAA.

Various theater productions by participating groups will be featured, as well as discussions and an evening viewing of "Fiddler on the Roof," directed by Robert E. Ingham, a UM drama instructor.

Festival productions will include chamber theater, readers' theater, choral readings or combinations of the three. Production time limit has been extended to 30 minutes from the previous 20-minute maximum.

Sponsored jointly by the UM Department <sup>s</sup> of Speech Communication <sup>and</sup> /Drama and the UM Debate and Oratory Association, the festival is open without charge to students. Those who have officially registered will be given seating priority.

A registration fee of \$2 per person or \$10 per group, whichever is less, will be charged.

Participating artist-critics will include Ingham, who is a professional actor, director and playwright; Dr. G. Bruce Loganbill, director of the oral interpretation program at California State College, Long Beach; Rolland R. Meinholtz, a UM drama instructor who is a director, playwright and actor in the Montana Repertory Theater at UM; and Dr. Paul Roland, past president of the ITAA and a Readers Theater producer at the University of Waterloo, Waterloo, Ont., Can.
