FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Mrs. Grace McCulloh, Sands Point, N. Y., has given the Montana State University Foundation certificates of International Business Machine stock, valued on the date of receipt at \$21,510, to fund an Albyn F. McCulloh Scholarship in the MSU Law School, Dean Robert E. Sullivan announced.

Mrs. McCulloh's gift establishes a scholarship fund memorializing her husband, a 1930 MSU law alumnus, who died July 9, 1963, while vacationing in Rome, Italy. He was Petroleum County attorney for two years before moving to New York, where he served with IBM in various capacities for 25 years, retiring in 1960 as special counsel for the corporation.

Mrs. McCulloh stipulated that income from the stock or from the reinvestment of funds from its sale be used for scholarships for worthy law students who are residents of Montana. The recipient or recipients each year will be selected by the dean of the Law School.

"The University and the Law School are indebted to Mrs. McCulloh for her generosity and her interest in young Montanans who wish to become lawyers but lack the necessary financial resources," Dean Sullivan said.
