KUNSTLER LECTURE STILL
SLATED FOR FRIDAY NIGHT AT UM

MISSOULA--

The lecture rescheduled by William Kunstler for 8:15 p.m. Friday (April 23) at the University of Montana Theater will take place as planned, according to the American Program Bureau, Boston, Mass., the agency handling Kunstler's speaking engagements.

Kunstler's lecture, which is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students of UM, had to be rescheduled from Wednesday night because the attorney has been defending one or more of those involved in the "Harlem 6" murder case in New York.

Friday's lecture is open to the public without charge.

Although Kunstler, a New York attorney, gained national fame for his defense of the Baltimore draft-record burners in the "Chicago 7" conspiracy trial, his main work has been in defense of civil rights leaders and organizations.
