Approximately 60 students from a social ecology class at Great Falls High School will visit the University of Montana campus Friday (May 7).

The students will attend several lectures dealing with a number of sociological areas. Speakers and the topics they will discuss include:

Dr. Richard E. Shannon, forestry professor, "Solving Man's Basic Economic Problem: Provisioning," 11 a.m., room 111, Business Administration Building; Dr. Wayne P. Van Meter, associate professor of chemistry, discussion of mercury contamination, 1 p.m., room 202, Psychology Building, and a laboratory in the Chemistry Building; Dr. Clarence Gordon, botany professor, discussion of environmental problems and Glacier Park study, 2:15 p.m., room 105, Natural Science Building.

Great Falls teachers in charge of the students will include science instructors William F. Thomas and Vern Frank.

The students will attend a noon luncheon Friday in the University Center Gold Oak Room.
