24 STUDENTS NAMED HAYNES WORTHY SCHOLARS AT UM

MISSOULA --

A total of 24 incoming University of Montana freshmen have been named as Haynes Worthy Scholars and will receive about \$9,000 in scholarships for the 1971-72 academic year.

Established in 1958, the Haynes Foundation, <u>Bozeman</u>, awards scholarships annually to worthy students at the University of Montana, Montana State University, <u>Bozeman</u>, and Carroll College, Helena.

The Haynes Foundation is headed by Mrs. Isabel Haynes and was established by her husband, the late Jack E. Haynes, who owned the Haynes Picture Shop in Yellowstone Park. The shop was begun in 1883 by the late F. Jay Haynes and stayed in the Haynes family through 1968.

Recipients of the scholarship are selected on the basis of academic achievement and need. They are selected by the UM Scholarship Committee.
