ARTISTS' CAMP FACULTY RECITAL
SCHEDULED FOR TUESDAY

MISSOULA--

Zaven Melikian, assistant concertmaster of the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra who was guest conductor of the Montana High School Fine Arts Camp Orchestra during the two-week camp at the University of Montana, will present a violin recital Tuesday (Aug. 17) at 8:15 p.m. in the UM Music Recital Hall.

The free public concert is one of three scheduled during the Montana High School Artists' Camp, which will be held on the UM campus Monday through Friday (Aug. 16-20).

Melikian will be assisted by Dr. Florence Reynolds, cello, a UM music professor who worked with string ensembles during the fine arts camp, and Freddi Ibsen, piano, a 1971 graduate of the UM music department.

Works performed during the recital will include "Praeludium and Allegro" by Fritz Kreisler; "Sonata in D minor, Opus 108, For Piano and Violin" by Johannes Brahms, and "Trio in D minor, Opus 49, For Piano, Violin and Cello" by Felix Mendelssohn.

The 30 students attending the Artists' Camp were selected during the high school camp to remain on the UM campus for more concentrated study, according to Donald A. Carey, camp director and a UM assistant music professor, because of their outstanding talents in the field of music.

Other concerts schedule this week include the final UM performance of the Atlanta String Quartet Thursday (Aug. 19) and the Artists' Camp final concert Friday (Aug. 20). Both concerts are scheduled for 8:15 p.m. in the Music Recital Hall.
