ADMISSION CREDENTIALS
DUE SEPT. 1 AT UM

MISSOULA--

Students seeking admission to the University of Montana are urged to submit their applications and credentials prior to Sept. 1, according to Jack L. Hoover, director of admissions on the Missoula campus.

Hoover said the great number of students applying for admission this fall has made it necessary to observe the Wednesday deadline.

"We already have 3,000 new students admitted for fall quarter and we're receiving between 30 and 40 new applications per day," Hoover emphasized.

"If all credentials--including high school grades, college transcripts, the application fee of \$10, etc.--have not been received by Sept. 1, they will not be processed until we have completed those received prior to the Sept. 1 deadline," he added.

The University will have great difficulty in processing admission applications prior to registration Sept. 20-22 if credentials arrive after the Sept. 1 deadline.

Hoover said students applying for admission after the Sept. 1 deadline may encounter difficulty obtaining the courses they wish to study during fall quarter.

Students will be notified by mail as soon as they have been accepted for admission to UM. No registration materials are prepared for students before they have been officially accepted for admission.

Hoover said University officials regret that the observance of the Sept. 1 deadline may pose some problems for applicants who have just now decided to attend UM.

"However," Hoover explained, "the volume of new applicants has necessitated this action."
