IDAHO SUPREME COURT JUSTICE TO ADDRESS CITIZENS' CONFERENCE

'IISSOULA--

Joseph R. 'McFadden, Boise, Idaho, associate justice of the Idaho Sumreme Court, will be one of the featured speakers at the third Citizens' Conference on the Montana Judicial System at the University of Montana.

The conference, scheduled for Oct. 15 in the University Center, will study the findings of two previous conferences and review a judicial article being prepared for the forthcoming Constitutional Convention.

Justice McFadden will speak at the noon luncheon in the University Center following a general conference session of invited delegates.

Justice McFadden was appointed to the Supreme Court of Idaho in Dec., 1959, to fill the vacancy left by the death of Chief Justice James W. Porter. He was re-elected in Justice McFadden 1960 and 1966. He served as chief justice in 1966 and again in 1969. Presently / is one of the members of the Board of Directors of the American Judicature Society.

More than 150 people are expected to attend the conference, sponsored by the Citizens' Conference for Court Improvement. George Schotte, Helena, chairman of the Citizens' Conference, will welcome the delegates in the MC Ballroom and report on the first two conferences.

Schotte, a University of Montana graduate, was district director of the Small Business Administration for Montana from 1967 to 1971.

The afternoon session on Oct. 15 will be a series of rotating panel discussions on different aspects of court improvement. Panelists and moderators will be from North Dakota, Washington, Idaho, Colorado and Montana.
