KATHERINE WEIST TO DISCUSS
'STATUS OF WOMEN CROSS-CULTURALLY'
TUESDAY AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA--

Dr. Katherine M. Weist, an assistant professor of anthropology at the University of Montana, will discuss "The Status of Women Cross-Culturally" Tuesday (Oct. 12) as the third lecturer in a symposium on women.

Tuesday's lecture, which is open to both men and women without charge, will be at 8 p.m. in room 103 of the UM Liberal Arts Building. The program will deal primarily with the status of women in areas covered by anthropology.

"We will discuss the influence that women exert covertly, relative to the positions in society which are controlled by men," Dr. Weist said.

Carolyn L. Wheeler, an English instructor at the University, will be master of ceremonies during Tuesday's program. She also is co-organizer of the lecture series, which is sponsored by the UM College of Arts and Sciences Office.

University faculty members participating in the program contribute their time to the series without charge.

The lecture series is entitled "Reality and Reaction: A Symposium on Women."

Dr. Weist is a member of the American Anthropological Association, American Society for Ethnohistory and the Society for Applied Anthropology.
