WORK BY D. K. SMUIN TO BE FEATURED SUNDAY IN UNIVERSITY RECITAL

MISSOULA --

A composition by D. K. Smuin, Missoula, will be featured during a faculty recital at 8:15 p.m. Sunday (Oct. 17) in the University of Montana Music Recital Hall. The program is open to the public without charge.

The Smuin work, entitled "Number I," will be performed by Dr. Florence Reynolds, a UM music professor, on the cello. It is the first in a series of three compositions planned by Smuin for unaccompanied cello.

"Number I" was written in 1965 by Smuin, a former University student. While attending UM, he studied composition under Eugene Weigel, a UM music professor.

Piano accompanist during Sunday's recital, which is sponsored by the UM School of Fine Arts and Department of Music, will be Rudolph Wendt, a UM music professor.

Other works besides Smuin's on the program will include "Sonata No. 1 in G" by Bach, "Sonata for arpeggione and piano" by Schubert and "Suite for Cello, opus 72" by Britten.

Dr. Reynolds said Sunday will be the first time the Britten work has been performed in Missoula and only the second time it has been done in the state. It was written in 1964 for the Russian cellist Rostropovich.

Dr. Reynolds is a native of Cape Cod, Mass. She holds a bachelor's degree, master's degree and a doctorate from the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N.Y.
