MALMSTROM OFFICERS
TO ATTEND HOMECOMING
FOOTBALL GAME SATURDAY

MISSOULA--

Minuteman Missile launch control officers participating in the University of Montana's Master of Business Administration degree program at Malmstrom Air Force Base, Great Falls, will attend Saturday's (Oct. 23) UM Homecoming Football Game at Dornblaser Stadium in Missoula.

Thirty Air Force officers and a number of their wives are slated to attend the game between the UM Grizzlies and the University of the Pacific Tigers beginning at 2:15 p.m. at Dornblaser Stadium.

The MBA program, sponsored by the Air Force Institute of Technology, was started at the Malmstrom facility in the summer of 1968.

Seventeen officers were enrolled in the program in 1968 and the program has since grown to include 170 officers who devote considerable time to their classes and studies during off-duty hours.

The program is under the direction of the UM School of Business Administration. Dr. Bernard J. Bowlen, Great Falls, is resident administrator for the MBA program.

Dr. Bowlen, who also is slated to attend Saturday's game in Missoula, said the University's educational program at Malmstrom is now the largest of its kind in the nation.
