ASUM FILM SOCIETY
CONTINUES FREE MOVIES

MISSOULA--

The Film Society of the Associated Students of the University of Montana, under a \$3,000 grant from ASUM Program Council, will continue showing free films next quarter.

"The purpose of the movies is to expose students to foreign films that otherwise they would not see," according to Roman Zylawy, foreign language instructor and faculty adviser.

The ASUM Film Society was formed in the fall of 1970 and was funded by season ticket sales.

"In the two showings last year that were open to the public without charge, attendance was considerably greater," Zylawy explained, "and from this we decided to seek outside help in order to have all the movies free."

After being funded by the ASUM Program Council, movies were selected and are now being shown on a weekly basis in the University Center Ballroom at 9 p.m., usually on Wednesdays.

"The movies are chosen on their artistic value as a film medium because cinema has become one of the modern art forms and we want to create an interest in it," Zylawy said.

"Suggestions for selections have come from many different sources and are always welcome," he added.

Selections shown to date have come from France, Sweden and Czechoslovakia. Also included on this quarter's calendar is an American and an English film.
