WILLIAM EVANS TO LECTURE TUESDAY IN UM SERIES ON WOMEN

MISSOULA --

Dr. William B. Evans, an associate professor of history at the University of Montana, will be keynote speaker for the seventh in a series of public lectures about women at 8 p.m. Tuesday (Nov. 9) in room 103 of the UN Liberal Arts Building.

The title of Dr. Evans' discussion is "Women's Fight for the 'Rights of Man' in 19th Century America." Tuesday's lecture and a discussion period following Dr. Evans' talk are open to both men and women. There will be no admission charge.

Dr. Evans joined the UM faculty in 1965. He received his bachelor's degree in 1955 and his master's degree in 1957, both from the University of Colorado, Boulder. He was awarded his doctorate in 1965 at the University of Washington, Seattle.

Carolyn L. Wheeler, an English instructor at the University, is co-organizer of the lecture series, which is sponsored by the UN College of Arts and Sciences Office.

University faculty members participating in the program contribute their time to the series without charge.

The lecture series is entitled "Reality and Reaction: A Symposium on Women."
