JOURNALISM PROFESSORS
PUBLISH ANTHOLOGY

MISSOULA--

Two University of Montana journalism professors are the editors of a 352-page anthology of articles from the Montana Journalism Review that has just been published by Mountain Press of Missoula.

Entitled "A Century of Montana Journalism" (Mountain Press, Missoula, \$7.50), the hard-back book is now on sale in Missoula.

Warren J. Brier, dean of the journalism school, and Nathan B. Blumberg, journalism professor, are editors of the anthology, which comprises 35 articles about the Montana press from the first newspaper in 1864 to the present.

The articles appeared originally in the Montana Journalism Review from 1958 to 1971. The Montana Journalism Review, published by the UM School of Journalism, was the first scholarly journal issued regularly by an American journalism school.

The Montana Journalism Review was founded in 1958 by Nathan B. Blumberg, then dean of the School of Journalism, and Frederick T. C. Yu, associate professor of journalism and editor of the periodical until 1962. Dr. Brier has been editor since 1962.

Dr. Brier has been dean of the journalism school since 1968 and a faculty member at UM since 1962. He is the author of the book "The Frightful Punishment" and co-author, with Howard C. Heyn, of the text "Writing for Newspapers and News Services." He holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Washington, Seattle, a master's degree from Columbia University, New York City, and a doctorate from the University of Iowa, Iowa City.

Dr. Blumberg has been a professor at the UI School of Journalism since 1956 and he served as UI journalism dean from 1956 to 1968. He is the author of the book "One Party Press?" and also articles in several periodicals. He holds a bachelor's degree and master's degree from the University of Colorado, Boulder, and a doctorate from Oxford University in England, where he was a Rhodes Scholar.

With two exceptions, the articles were written by Montana journalism graduates, students, professors and lecturers.

Some of the selections and their authors include "Montana's First Newspaper" by Dorothy H. Johnson, "The Post's Mysterious Franklin" by Penny Wagner Wilson, "Election-Day Editorials" by Carl H. Rieckmann, and "Profile of a Sportswriter" (an essay on Ray T. Rocene) by Steve L. Smith.
