JAMES WHITE IN VIOLIN  
RECITAL AT UM DEC. 1

MISSOULA--

Violinist James White, 27, will be featured in a free public recital at 8:15 p.m. Wednesday (Dec. 1) in the University of Montana Music Recital Hall.

White, a music instructor at UM, will be assisted during the program by the Montana Little Symphony, directed by Jerry Domer, an assistant professor of music at UM.

Works featured during Wednesday's performance will include "Romance in F major, opus 50" by Beethoven, "Scherzo-Tarentelle, opus 16" by Wieniawski and "Concerto for Violin, opus 64" by Mendelssohn.

The faculty recital is sponsored by the University School of Fine Arts and Department of Music.

White came to UM this fall from the staff of Brigham Young University, where he taught violin and served as assistant to the conductor of the BYU symphony while working for a Master of Music degree, which was awarded in 1971.

Following his graduation from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, he was a scholarship student at the American Conservatory of Music at Fontainebleau, France. After a year of study in Paris, he attended the Juilliard School of Music in New York.

White, a former member of the Oakland, Calif., Symphony, is director of the Missoula Symphony Orchestra while Eugene Andrie, a UM music professor, is on sabbatical leave.
