Glenn Yarbrough and the Havenstock River Band will perform at the University of Montana Friday (Dec. 3).

The performance, which will begin at 8:15 p.m. in the University Center Ballroom, is sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students of UI.

Yarbrough, a former member of a well known singing trio, the Limelites, has produced a number of hits. He has appeared in more than 3,000 college concerts.

The singer is founder of a school for underprivileged children known as SCHOLE-- School for Children of Happiness, Opportunity, Love and Education--which is now accepting paying students.

Members of the Havenstock River Band include Archie Johnson, Jeff Warren, Gordy Curry, Geoff Pike and Gary Clontz. The group's instrumental specialities include electric guitars and piano, harmonica, drums and organ.

Tickets for Friday night's performance are available at the University Center Ticket Office and the Missoula Mercantile Record Shop. Tickets are \$2 and \$3 for University students and \$3 and \$4 for the general public.
