CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES  
May 29, 1945

The meeting was called to order by the president, and the minutes of the May 22 meeting were read and corrected. Briggs' motion in paragraph four was corrected to read as follows:

Briggs moved that the committee appointed to study Publications Board be instructed to continue exploring the problem of Publications Board personnel and voting and non-voting membership.

A notation of this correction is to be submitted by the secretary to all persons keeping permanent files of the Central Board minutes.

Jo Ann Blair, chairman of the committee to study Publications Board, (Jo Ann Blair, Frank McCarty, Jan Johnson, and Mr. Cogswell), submitted the following tentative program for Publications Board personnel and voting and non-voting membership:

(1) Voting Membership

a. The chairman of the Board who is to be the two-year Senior representative to Central Board

b. Five members appointed by Central Board

c. Publications advisor appointed by the university

(2) Non-voting Membership

a. All editors of student publications

b. All advisors of student publications

c. Student auditor

Badgley moved that the membership of Publications Board be composed of the following:

(1) Voting Membership

a. The chairman, who is to be the two-year Senior representative to Central Board

b. Five members to be appointed by Central Board, not more than two to be majors of the same department

c. Publications advisor to be appointed by the President of the University on the approval of Central Board

(2) Non-voting Membership

a. All editors and advisors of recognized student publications

b. The student auditor

Castle seconded, and the motion passed.

Anne Fraser, vice-president of the Freshman class, brought the question of a Green Day for Freshman before Central Board. It was decided that the question should be settled by the Freshmen and Traditions Board.

Members of Central Board were invited to a meeting Thursday, May 31, at 7:30 in the Eloise Knowles' Room by Stewart Brandborg, chairman of a student committee which has been operating independently this year and which wants to have Central Board approve it. Recommendations for the approval of the committee are to be submitted to the faculty and others interested.

Mary Brome asked for approval of an appropriation of \$60 to pay for the Freshman dance next fall. Sackett moved that Central Board appropriate \$60 to the Social Committee for the Freshman dance. Floyd seconded, and the motion passed.

Davis moved that we have the final dance of the school year on Friday, June 1. Floyd seconded, and the motion passed. The dance was put in the hands of the Social Committee.

Oakley Coffee of the Community Concert Association appeared before Central Board and asked that we limit the number of student seats for each Community Concert program to 500 for the year 1945-46. He stated that there were 1200 seats sold in Missoula, while there were 1400 seats in the auditorium. Usually 600 of these seats were promised to students. Arrangements had been made with the University for the sale of a block of seats for a flat fee. The Community Concert Association will make a financial adjustment if we agree to give up 100 student seats. Only 500 tickets could be issued for each program, so that only that number of students could come. Mr. Coffee stated that an average of 400 students attended this year. The refund amount due to the students is \$112. The price will be \$960 on the old basis with the new tax. We would pay the Community Concert Association \$800 this year on the 500 student seats. We would pay \$960 for the usual 600 seats. It is understood that the students will have their 600 seats again in 1946-47, as the arrangement is for 1945-46 only, and a letter will be sent to ASMSU Central Board to the effect that this arrangement is for one year only.

Morrow moved that we agree with the Community Concert Association to limit the number of student seats for the Community Concerts to 500 for 1945-46 and for that year only. The cost will be \$800 including the tax. Sackett seconded, and the motion passed.

Crowder suggested that we bring artists, available by the Committee of Association of American Colleges and Artists, to the campus for two days. Evening recital, convocation, and lessons would be available to the students. Cost to the institution would be \$125-200, plus hotel bill; the Carnegie Fund making up the difference of costs. Crowder wondered if it would be possible to have the programs open only to Community Concert members and to students and then make the refund of the difference in lessening the number of seats. Badgley said to have those remaining in Missoula during the summer take care of this problem. Davis moved that Badgley, Briggs, Castle, Brome, Garrison, and Murphey be on the committee to make arrangements concerning the special program with cooperation of the Community Concert Association and Crowder. Brome seconded, and the motion passed.

Sackett moved that Central Board approve the appointment of X Jim Lucas as Chairman of the Convocations Committee. Morrow seconded, and the motion passed.

Morrow moved that Central Board approve the appointment of the following people to the M Book committee: Lois Pat Nelson, chairman, Jane Murphey, Marjorie Powell, Leone Howard, and Jean Bessire. Sackett seconded, and the motion passed.

Badgley suggested that Central Board consider appropriating funds for the following three things: (1) Tennis court repair. (2) Display in the Student Union to show historical pictures of student activities.

Coach Dahlberg wants panel pictures of all athletic teams that have represented the University up to the present time and the history of what happened. Cyrile Van Duser is interested in presenting information about the Masquers, etc. (3) Time clock in the gymnasium for basketball. The cost would be approximately \$500 for each of the fore-mentioned things. Sackett moved that Central Board give the Missoula committee the power to act on these three problems. Morrow seconded, and the motion passed.

Badgley moved that Central Board approve the appointment of the following people to the Social Committee: Jo Ann Blair, Lois Sanders, Speed Grater, and Pete Small. Castle seconded, and the motion passed.

Meeting adjourned.
