The Army ROTC scholarships will pay all tuition, textbook and lab fees, and each of the three students will receive \$100 in monthly subsistence allowances.

This fall, 1,067 high school graduates were awarded four-year AROTC scholarships.

More than 2,000 scholarships are expected to be offered in 1972. There are over 5,500 students presently attending colleges under the scholarships.
