FORMER UM STUDENT IS
RHODES SCHOLARSHIP WINNER

MISSOULA--

Timothy James Toohey, a former student at the University of Montana, Missoula, was chosen to receive one of 32 Rhodes Scholarships given to U.S. students this year. He was the only Montanan listed to receive the coveted award this year.

Toohey attended UM during the 1968-69 academic year, majoring in history and political science. He is son of James T. Toohey, Bozeman.

A 1968 graduate of Bozeman Senior High School, Toohey is a senior at Stanford University, Stanford, Calif., where he transferred after his freshman year at UM.

The Rhodes Scholarship consists of two years of undergraduate study at Oxford University, Oxford, England, leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree in the individual's major field. Toohey said his study will be "readings in Modern European History, a comprehensive field encompassing medieval history to the present time."

"At the end of the two years, you are given one examination to test your knowledge of the subject," he said.

While at UM, Toohey maintained a 3.80 (above B plus) grade point average. He said he enjoyed his classes and thought it was good to go to a school in his home state his first year. He said he particularly liked studying music under Professor George Hummel/^{at UM}and participating in the summer music program in Vienna, Austria.

The former UM student will begin his studies at Oxford in October 1972.
