800-BOOK DISPLAY AT UM LIBRARY JULY 9-AUG. 15 FOR STUDENTS, TEACHERS

MISSOULA--

More than 800 new library books for elementary and high school students and teachers will be exhibited in the University of Montana Library entrance from Monday (July 9) through Aug. 15.

Mrs. Geneva Van Horne, assistant professor of library education at UM, said more than 450 of the books are for preschool through 6th grade students, more than 300 are directed to pupils in grades 7-12 and about 75 are for teachers. Annotated lists are provided for those interested in the exhibit.

Many of the books--both fiction and nonfiction--have broad interest appeal, lively style and illustrations, according to Van Horne.

The exhibit will be open during regular UN Library hours--7:30 a.m.-10 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 7:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday; 8 a.m.-noon Saturday, and 6 p.m.-midnight Sunday.
