27 COLLEGE MATHEMATICS TEACHERS
PARTICIPATING IN SUMMER INSTITUTE
AT UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA, MISSOULA

MISSOULA, Mont.--

A total of 27 college mathematics teachers from 18 states are participating in a summer institute through Aug. 10 at the University of Montana, Missoula, to supplement their training.

Title of the program is the Office of Education Summer Institute for Teachers of Mathematics in Developing Colleges.

The program, funded under a \$36,500 grant from the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, is designed for teachers from four-year colleges, particularly those with students from minority groups.

The UM Department of Mathematics conducted similar programs at UM in the summers of 1970, 1971 and 1972 with Office of Education support.

Dr. Gloria C. Hewitt, professor of mathematics at UM, is director of the institute. Dr. D. George McRae, assistant professor of mathematics at UM, is associate director of the program.
