JAMES DARDEN FIRST OF 85 COMMISSIONEES
RECENTLY AT FORT LEWIS, WASH.

MISSOULA, Mont.--

James E. Darden, 25, formerly of Great Falls, Mont., who received his bachelor's degree in pre-medical sciences June 10 at the University of Montana, Missoula, was the first of 85 cadets to be commissioned second lieutenants July 12 at the Army ROTC Advanced Camp at Fort Lewis, Wash.

Darden, who is son of Betty Schill, 3998 Brockbank Drive, Salt Lake City, Utah, graduated from C. M. Russell High School, Great Falls, in June 1966.

Granted a four-year educational delay before going on active duty as an Army officer, Darden plans to enter the University of Guadalajara in Mexico for the study of pre-medical sciences. After he graduates from medical school Darden plans to enter the Army Medical Corps as a captain.
