### 'FACULTY BAROQUE CHAMBER RECITAL' SET FOR TUESDAY AT UNIVERSITY

### MISSOULA --

A "Faculty Baroque Chamber Recital," the first free public recital of the 1973-74 academic year by the University of Montana's Department of Music, will be presented at 8 p.m. Tuesday (Oct. 9) in the UM Music Recital Hall.

The program is open to the public without charge under the sponsorship of the UM School of Fine Arts and music department.

Tuesday's program also will be the first public concert by Dr. Florence Reynolds, UM music professor, since she returned from a sabbatical leave in Europe. She will play the violoncello.

Other UM music faculty members besides Reynolds participating in the program include Priscilla Chadduck, instructor, soprano; Eugene Andrie, professor, and Michael Leib, graduate assistant, violins; Gerald Doty, professor, viola; Richard Cohen, visiting lecturer, string bass; Jerry Domer, assistant professor, oboe; Edwin Rosenkranz, associate professor, bassoon; Lucien Hut, associate professor, piano and harpsichord, and Constance Speake, assistant professor, harpsichord.

Works to be presented Tuesday include "Sonata No. 3 in E major" and Kantate Nr. 202 "Weichet nur, betrubte Schatten" by Bach and "Sonata in G minor" by Vivaldi.
