'ALL THE KING'S MEN' TO LAUNCH
1973-74 DRAMA SEASON AT UM

MISSOULA--

The 1973-74 drama season, featuring nine productions and a \$15 season ticket rate, will get under way at the University of Montana with the Montana Repertory Theater (MRT) production of "All The King's Men" at 8 p.m. Oct. 25-28 in the University Theater.

Each person with a special \$15 season ticket may obtain a reserved seat in either the Masquer Theater or University Theater for the nine productions to be presented at UM during the 1973-74 academic year. Regular admission prices for the general public for individual performances are \$3 for MRT productions and \$2 for UM Department of Drama productions.

Tickets may be reserved for "All The King's Men" by phoning the University Theater box office, 243-4581.

The special \$15 season tickets may be obtained until mid-November at the UT box office. Box office hours are 10 a.m.-5 p.m. weekdays and noon-5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Frank Jacobson, a UM drama instructor, is managing director of the MRT.
