EILEEN RICKER MEMORIAL FUND TO BE USED FOR PHARMACY LOANS AT UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

MISSOULA --

The Eileen Ricker Memorial Fund, valued at \$400, has been placed in the Student Loan Fund of the University of Montana School of Pharmacy, Dr. Robert L. Van Horne, UM pharmacy dean, has announced.

Mrs. Ricker, who died April 26, 1973, in <u>Lewistown</u>, was a pharmacist there with her husband, Lynn. She was a registered pharmacist in Denver, Colo., before moving to Montana in 1944.

Two sons of the Rickers who attended Fergus County High School, Lewistown, are students in the UM pharmacy school. Robert, 21, who previously attended Montana State University, Bozeman, for two years, is a sophmore at UM, and James, 18, is a freshman on the Missoula campus. Robert is a 1970 graduate of FCHS and James received his high school diploma there last June.

Lynn Ricker credited two Lewistown women with suggesting that the Eileen Ricker

Memorial Fund be placed in the UM School of Pharmacy's Student Loan Fund. They are Mrs.

Dorothea MacKenzie and Mrs. Gertude Gates.
