## ART DISPLAY BY NANCY ERICKSON ON DISPLAY THROUGH WEDNESDAY AT UM

MISSOULA---

An art display featuring several three-dimensional fabric sculptures by Nancy Erickson of Missoula will be exhibited through Wednesday (Nov. 21) in the University Center Art Gallery at the University of Montana.

The exhibit is open to the public without charge from 11a.m.- 3 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. weekdays and 7-9 p.m. Sunday.

Erickson, who received her master of fine arts degree at UM in 1968, has been working with fabrics and related media for five years. The current exhibit at UM is her first showing of fabric sculptures in Missoula and her first art show in the Garden City since her thesis exhibit in 1968.

"Some of the works in the University Center display are environmental pieces which were inspired by herbicidal defoliation in Vietnam," Erickson said.
