Patricia Douglas, director of Extension and Continuing Education at the University of Montana, has been appointed by UM President Robert T. Pantzer as Director of Summer Session programs at the University.

Douglas will incorporate the responsibilities of the University's summer programs into the office of Extension and Continuing Education. She was responsible for planning the 1973 Summer Pre-Session and the special course offerings during the regular session.

Douglas received her Bachelor of Arts degree from UM in 1963, and her master of business administration and doctorate from the University of California, Berkeley.

UM associate professor of business administration from 1966 to 1972, Douglas has been a frequent contributor to the Montana Business Quarterly and she has done research work for Montana's Legislative Council and the Helena branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis. In 1968 she was named the Outstanding Young Woman of the Year in Montana.

She has been the recipient of a Ford Foundation Fellowship and is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Western Montana Chapter of the National Association of Accountants, Woman's Society of Certified Public Accountants and Gamma Sigma, a business honorary.

Raised on a ranch near Twodot, Dr. Douglas and her husband now reside in Lolo.
