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### Documents from the November 21, 1944 meeting of the Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM)

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CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES

Nov. 21, 1944

Burdick called the meeting to order.

Castle brought up the appointment of Cyril Van Duser as Sentinel advisor and it was decided the appointment would be for one year as the next Student Union Business Manager might not be interested as Miss Van Duser is in the work. Also the question of whether the Sentinel advisor would have to be the Student Union Business Manager or whether it might be someone else interested in the work was discussed. Mr. Moore is to remain the faculty advisor on Publications Board. The motion making the Sentinel advisor a regular voting member of Publications Board was tabled until the original motion could be had to see whether the advisor could vote.

Kinkade moved that business concerning membership on Publications Board be tabled until last year's minutes can be read concerning the amendments made. Dillavou seconded and the motion carried.

Dillavou said the Missoula High School would like permission to ring the Victory Bell if they should win the championship game which is to be played here Thanksgiving Day. Traditions Board could not decide whether or not to grant this privilege because it would mean that Billings High School should have the same right if they win the game. While MSU students might not object to this action this year, in the future it might easily become a troublesome issue because any high school playing a championship game here would naturally expect to ring the bell. Bakke moved that Central Board does not grant Missoula High School permission to ring the Victory Bell in the event they are the winners of the championship game which is to be played here Thanksgiving Day. Kinkade seconded and the motion carried.

MacKenzie asked Central Board if it would be alright not to charge the cadets admission to the Holiday Ball to be held Dec. 2 because the cadets have given several dances and have not charged the regular students admission. The orchestra will cost \$60.00 and the programs \$16.00 and it is doubtful that the dance will even pay for itself. Castle suggested that Central Board back the Holiday Ball and not charge admission to anyone. It was also suggested that Social Committee outline a program of dances and parties to be scheduled throughout the year and present a report to Central Board early in the fall. Approximately \$100.00 will cover the expenses for the Holiday Ball. Dillavou moved that Central Board back the Holiday Ball to be held Dec. 2 and that no admission be charged. Bakke seconded and the motion carried.

Sackett wanted to know if Central Board would back the Sadie Hawkins Dance to be held Dec. 7 under the same conditions as last year. Last year the Spurs were given fifty percent of the profits with a maximum of \$30.00. Bakke said the last year the Spurs made about \$100.00 on the dance. Sackett moved that Central Board back the Sadie Hawkins Dance under the conditions set down last year and that the Spurs receive fifty percent of the profits with a maximum of \$30.00. Floyd seconded and the motion carried.

Richards suggested a convocation be held in which the students could make suggestions from the floor regarding criticisms and ideas concerning the campus in order that the Betterments Committee would have some idea of what improvements the students desire. Richards also said that suggestions may be handed in to her, to any of the class officers, or to Burdick.

Meeting adjourned.
