The special Northern Pacific train to Bozeman for the Grizzly-Bobcat game will not, as in the past, have the official sponsorship of the University of Montana, it was announced by Dean of Students, A. C. Cogswell. "No excuses will be given students missing Saturday classes and no faculty members will be asked by the Dean of Students office to accompany the train as chaperones," Dean Cogswell said.

"Passengers on the train, whether students or townspeople, will be responsible, of course, to the Northern Pacific Railroad and its officials for their conduct, just as they are responsible to the railroad when riding any of its other trains. Members of Ray Cosman's ASUM Committee, which is assisting the Northern Pacific in the promotion of the train, will cooperate, I am sure, with the railroad in every way possible, so that future special trains can be assured," he continued.

University women who plan to take the train and who have permits from parents on file in the Associate Dean of Students office authorizing travel "by public conveyance" will check out in the usual manner from their living groups. Others may have to receive letters from their parents approving the trip, Cogswell said.
