CENTRAL BOARD MINUTES  
November 9, 1943

President Cuthbert called the meeting to order and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Cuthbert announced that arrangements have been made to devote a winter quarter convocation to the observance of International Students' Day; a brief announcement regarding this will be made at the November 24th convc.

The following people were recommended for financial chairmen of their respective activities: Larrae Haydon, Masquerade; Peggy Thrallkill, Kaimin; Sue Fraser, Sentinel; Clarence Bell, Band; Eileen Flumb, Traditions Board; Ralph Y. McGinnis, Debate and Oratory; Ed Voldseth, Convocations; Marguerite McGroel, Womens' Athletics; Francis Vranish, Senior Class; and Maylou Pomeroy, Outside Entertainment. Castle moved that we approve these recommendations for financial chairman to be responsible to Central Board for expenditures of funds appropriated by the board. Murphy seconded, and the motion carried.

Three members of the WAA board were present to request the Board's reconsideration of the Womens' Athletic budget appropriation. Kay Willis, President, explained that their year's program had been set up with the expectation of a budget appropriation to include some of the rally and fireside expense, which she believes is a necessary part of the athletic program. As the program was outlined in the WAA Handbook, which was distributed to freshmen women before the approval of the new budget, and which was effective in promoting their participation, the WAA board feels that it would be very difficult to make a change in their plans, at this time. Castle moved that Central Board reconsider the recommendation of the Budget and Finance Committee and for the present year allow The Womens' Athletic Association to expend funds for their program as outlined in the handbook. Hansen seconded the motion and it carried.
