VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES SCHEDULED FOR CLASS AA TOURNAMENT PARTICIPANTS

MISSOULA--

An all-tourney dance at the Sentinel High School gymnasium and a variety of fine arts and general interest activities at the University of Montana sponsored by the Program Council of the Associated Students of UM are among the events planned for the State AA High School Basketball Tournament March 8-10 in Missoula, Frank C. McElwain has announced.

McElwain, director of special services for Missoula County high schools, said high school students from <u>Billings</u>, <u>Bozeman</u>, <u>Butte</u>, <u>Great Falls</u>, <u>Havre</u> and <u>Missoula</u>, as well as their parents and school personnel are invited "to make themselves at home while they are in Missoula for the tournament."

Teams competing for the state class-AA crown in the Harry Adams Field House at UM will be Billings Senior High School; Butte Public High School; C. M. Russell and Great Falls Public High Schools from the Electric City; Bozeman Senior High School; Havre High School, and Hellgate and Sentinel High Schools, Missoula.

The all-tourney dance will be from 10 p.m.-12:30 a.m. Friday (March 9) at Sentinel. In addition to the scheduled three-day series of events, the University Center recreation area will be open to tournament visitors during regular hours from 7 a.m.-midnight Thursday and Friday (March 8 and 9), and Saturday (March 10) beginning at 9 a.m.

The Grizzly Pool will be open from 7-9 p.m. Thursday and Friday (March 8-9) and from 2-4 p.m. Saturday (March 10). The men's gymnasium will be available for basketball and possibly volleyball from 9 a.m.-9 p.m. Friday (March 9) and from 9 a.m.-6 p.m. Saturday (March 10).
