FIVE UM FACULTY MEMBERS SELECTED AS
'OUTSTANDING EDUCATORS OF AMERICA'

Five members of the University of Montana faculty have been selected as "Outstanding Educators of America" for 1973 on the basis of their professional and civic achievements.

Chosen for the national recognition from UM are Dr. Robert F. Wambach, dean and professor of the UM forestry school; Dr. John J. Craighead, director of the Montana Cooperative Wildlife Research Unit; Dr. Lyle L. Berg, director of the Division of Educational Research and Services and assistant professor of education; Dr. Roy C. White, associate professor of education, and Dr. Milton K. Reimer, assistant professor of education.

"Outstanding Educators of America" is an annual awards program honoring distinguished men and women for their exceptional service, achievements and leadership in the field of education.

Each year those chosen as outstanding educators are featured in the national awards volume, "Outstanding Educators of America."

Nominations for the program are made by the officials of colleges and universities including presidents, deans and department heads. Their selection guidelines include an educator's talents in the classroom, contributions to research, administrative abilities, civic service and professional recognition.
