SELECTED FOR 1973-74
TEACHING POST IN FRANCE

MISSOULA--

Jeri Schaeffer Guthrie, a University of Montana alumna and June 1967 graduate of Billings Senior High School, has been elected by the French section of the University of Montana Department of Foreign Languages to teach during the 1973-74 academic year in France.

Mrs. Guthrie, who received her bachelor's degree in French at UM last spring, will teach English in a French high school to be designated by the French government in June. She currently is a graduate teaching assistant in French at UM and she is tentatively scheduled to complete requirements for her master's degree in French in June 1974 at UM.

While a student at Billings Senior High School, Mrs. Guthrie studied French under Mary Larsen and Pearl Schummer. She plans to finish her master's degree thesis in France.

Accompanying Mrs. Guthrie to France will be her husband, Mike, and daughter, Lisa. Mrs. Guthrie is daughter of Anne Selvidge, Billings, and Jerry Schaeffer, Colorado Springs, Colo.

Brenda Jean Speck, a UM graduate student in French from Whitehall, who received her bachelor's degree in psychology at UM in the spring of 1971, is the alternate candidate for the teaching assignment in France next year.

Miss Speck, a former Peace Corps trainee, is studying for her master's degree in French at UM. She is daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. Carroll Speck, Whitehall.

The/teaching assistant exchange program, which is under the supervision of Maureen C. Curnow, a UM instructor in French, began during the 1972-73 academic year. Charlene P. Matejovsky, Wolf Point, is teaching English in a Paris suburb and Helene C. Bourdon of Paris is a teaching assistant in French at UM under the program this year.

The teaching assistant exchange program is directed by the French Cultural Services.
