GOV. NELSON ROCKEFELLER'S ADDRESS SCHEDULED FOR 2 P.M. FRIDAY (APRIL 13)

MISSOULA --

A public address at the University of Montana by New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller has been scheduled for 2 p.m. Friday (April 13) in the University Center Ballroom, according to Thomas J. Collins, UM Foundation director and coordinator of Rockefeller's visit. The lecture is the fifth in the continuing Mansfield Lectures on International Relations.

Rockefeller will arrive in Missoula at 10:30 a.m. Friday (April 13) and leave the same day at 4:30 p.m.

In addition to the public lecture, the New York governor, who is serving his fourth term, will meet with faculty and students "as time permits," Collins said. No press conference has been scheduled.

The lecture series was established in 1967 through an endowment to the UM Foundation by Mike and Maureen Mansfield. The series, supported by donations of approximately \$120,000, was founded in recognition of the Senate Majority Leader's 25 years of congressional service and the University's 75th anniversary, which coincided in 1968.
