## FRENCH CULTURAL WEEK CONTINUES THROUGH SATURDAY AT UNIVERSITY

MISSOULA--

French Cultural Week, sponsored at the University of Montana by the UM Department of Foreign Languages, will continue through Saturday (April 14) in the UM Liberal Arts Building.

Among the features of cultural week activities are two French films and two discussions concerning French life to be conducted in English so more persons may participate.

"Bizarre Bizarre," a film farce concerning a detective story writer accused of a murder that never took place, will be shown free of charge at 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday (April 10 and 11) in LA 11.

Another film, "Hiroshima Mon Amour," a portrait of two people haunted by dark memories who are seeking escape in a fleeting love affair, will be shown at 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. Friday (April 13) in LA 11. Admission will be 50 cents.

The two discussions, also scheduled in LA 11, are "Discussion on Francophonie" (French speaking Africa), set for 8 p.m. Thursday (April 12), and "French Politics and Youth Today," a panel debate, at 8 p.m. Saturday (April 14). A 7 p.m., preceding each discussion, the UM French Club will present French songs and plays.

Roman Zylawy, instructor of French at UM, said the aim of the UM French Cultural Week is to promote the French culture as being a part of the American tradition. He noted that there are many French-Canadian descendents in the Missoula area whom he hopes will be interested in attending the cultural week activities.

Zylawy said that this cultural week is the pilot project for similar weeks to be presented by different sections of the UM Department of Foreign Languages. Local residents, especially high school students studying French, are invited to attend the activities.
