Dr. Jonathan Z. Smith, an associate professor of history of religions at the University of Chicago, will give a free public lecture entitled "The Worlds of Men in the History of Religions" Thursday at the University of Montana.

Thursday's lecture, which is open to the public without charge, will be at 8 p.m. in room 131 of the UM Science Complex.

Smith, who taught at Dartmouth College and at the University of California, Santa Barbara, is a successor to Mircea Eliade at the University of Chicago.
